TO ALL CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS AND THE MAYOR

Subject: Conditional Use Permit for a 65 foot tall wireless communication facility on the Peoria Elementary School property, known as CU16-0022 – Shangri-La.

When this proposal was put forth at the Elementary school there were a number of residents that attended, and the presentation took over an hour.

The presentation, dealt mainly with the aesthetics of the site. Pertinent questions were not answered, and some were totally ignored. Then, when attending the December 15, 2016 planning and zoning hearing, residents were allowed only 3 minutes to be heard, yet the third party representing the applicant was allowed to speak for over 15 minutes. These proceedings seem, extremely lopsided, toward the applicant, and little to no concern of the public's concerns, were entertain. Please keep in mind, **Peoria Ranked as 7th Best City to Live in U.S.**

Peoria is the only city in Arizona mentioned in this list, which is a testament to smart growth and development. I, for one, want Peoria to keep its rating and to even progress to a higher level. I believe that we can achieve that goal, by continuing to work together with our elected officials and having good and open lines of communications in order to share information that will further those goals. I had made a number of calls to P.U.S.D and to superintend Dr. Darwin Stiffle along with E-mails wanting to know answers to questions such as, who approves the applicant to go ahead with the request to the zoning board. What agreements, have been approved between the P.U.S.D and the applicant? Under what authority was this done since school property is paid for by property owner's school taxes? Is the P.U.S.D accountable to our elected officials of the City of Peoria, and if so to what degree? Who negotiated, what amount would be charged to lease this space, and since it was mention it would be \$400.00 per month, was consideration given, to the fact, that the applicant wants to lease out two other lower locations on this tower to other cell companies such as sprint, T-mobile, etc, and if that be the case, would each tenant be paying the school district separately, which would increase the income by three times and if not, and it is a flat fee, why? Why was it not, negotiated to charge 10% of all revenue of the traffic being transmitted over this tower?

As of this date I have never received an e-mail or phone call to discuss these issues from P.U.S.D. I am very disappointed with P.U.S.D unresponsiveness. May be these question should be answered by

In my conversations with Cody Gleason he informed me that the P.U.S.D. is a separate entity and was not accountable to the City of Peoria. He also stated that according to the FCC ruling, a permit could not be denied based on health issues.

Additionally, during the presentation that was given to the public at the Peoria elementary school, questions were asked and a majority of the answers were misleading. For instance, when the question was asked, what exactly is this tower? The answer was, it is a communications tower, used for communications like the phone company use's it facilities for communication purposes. This reply, equates, this communication tower with that of a land line Phone Company, and gives the impression that this is part of the phone company. Not true! Telephone companies are regulated under the Telecommunication Act passed by congress, where as wireless providers are non-regulated and do not have the ability to claim right of way, or Eminent domain. When the question of why 65 feet tall, the answer was because, that was, what was needed to cover the half mile area. Anyone knows, that even a hand held walkie talkie's can transmit any where from 1 to 5 miles and you do not have to be 65 feet in the air to accomplish a communication link between the two units. When pressed on this issue Mr. Jason Sanks, snapped back in his response, that this, is what the radio engineers required and that's all there, is to it. Once again, misleading information. It is in fact, what the radio engineers want but is not, what is required to cover a half mile radius. I do not want to get into a technical argument but rather, get to the meat & potatoes of this issue.

Given the facts of the FCC ruling that a permit could not be denied due to health concerns, nor, could we object about the board of education leasing out school property, because they were a separate entity, we might as well, just throw open the doors, to Verizon, AT&T, Sprint, T-Mobile and whatever other wireless, providers that wants access to all, of our elementary and high schools in Peoria and surrounding areas. After all we are being asked to set aside our zoning regulations, such as height of 50 feet limitations, ignore the objections of the residents, and ignore the fact that this is a residential area along with ignoring the fact that the board of education is now entering into a joint commercial business ventures. Yet the

primary questions were never answered by the applicant. Such as how many customers in this half mile area will be affected, if the permit was denied and to what extend? Other than a strictly business revenue generation, what is the dire necessity, to have this tower at this location. On what grounds does the applicant base his request? This area already, has not only cell service, but additionally also has wireless internet service. I have friends and neighbors in this area that have Verizon wireless service for internet access and none of them have any problem getting on to the net and getting their e-mails or surfing the net. I will be attaching a map of a four mile square area surrounding this proposed site which shows 75 towers and there locations. Additionally you will see Verizon 65 foot tower 3 tenths of a mile from the proposed site. You will also notice there are a 105 foot Verizon tower at 1.75 miles and two other cell towers at 95 feet and 85 feet in height at a little over 3 miles from this proposed site. So you may ask why this tower is being proposed at this site. Well, in the applicants presentation they did state that this site is focus on 4G-LTE and the, simplest explanation is that the "G" in 4G stands for generation, because 4G is the fourth generation of mobile data technology, as defined by the radio sector of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU-R). LTE stands for "Long Term Evolution" and applies more generally to the idea of improving wireless broadband speeds to meet increasing demand.

So what we are looking at in this issue is a tower that will be used to improve wireless broadband speeds. Not a telecommunications tower for strictly cell phone calls. When these proposals are put forth, most laypeople automatically think, it is just for making calls and it is part of the phone company, and the impressions that are implied by these applicants give a false sense that it is ok and even the FCC ruling tends to confirm those misconceptions by its ruling that permits cannot be denied for health concerns. However we have other means of getting control of our school properties, for I have not found any law that requires a municipality or school district to sub lease school property just for the asking by large industry named companies that wants to increase their bottom line and market place penetration. We should not be rubber stamping every conditional use permit that is requested without doing our due diligence, so to avoid being misled. Let's keep in mind a short time ago another large industry told the public

there was no scientific proof, that there was a link between cigarette smoking and lung cancer. We all know better now and that information was out there long before action was taken. So I find it very curious that the FCC would make a ruling stating permits cannot be denied for health reasons on one hand and then turns around in 1996, and established RF exposure safety guidelines for wireless devices in the U.S. One of these limits is expressed as a SPECIFIC ABSORPTION RATE or 'SAR' which is a measure of the rate of absorption of RF energy in the body. The FCC has required that the SAR of a handheld wireless device not exceed 1.6 watts per kilogram, average over one gram of tissue. This begs the question of what is the wattage output of a cell tower and what distance would be required to meet that same standard for safety reasons. This seems to be a direct contradiction, or as a famous American native saying states (white man speaks with fork tongue.)

In keeping within the directive of the FCC ruling we must ignore the multiple studies that have been done in other countries. One German study showed cancer rates more than tripled among people living within 400 meters of cell phone towers. It also found that those within 100 meters were exposed to radiation at 100 times normal levels. We must also ignore an Israeli study that found risk of cancer quadrupled among people living within 350 meters (1,148 feet) of a cell phone transmitter, and seven out of eight cancer victims were women. Also an Australian study found that children living near cell towers developed leukemia at three times the rate of children living miles away.

You can get a quick snap shot, which will take about ten minutes, of the research and studies done in Australia by Dr. Devra Davis if you go to YouTube video the truth about mobile phones and wireless radiation. It will be an eye opener. These studies have been performed by world renowned scientist and astoundingly, the federal government does not allow rejection of cell phone towers based on health risks, accord to a 2005 article. And a Google search found no evidence that this situation has changed. Yet over 1.9 million cell towers have been approved nationwide without federal studies to assure safety of those living nearby, and lack of knowledge and conflicting information or lack thereof by our government has

produced this situation. We are now looking at a twelve year gap that while technology has progressed from G2 to G3 and now to G4, yet our government still has not given any safety guidance when it comes to cell towers. While many other countries are exposing cause an effect relationship between cell towers and health concerns. Oh I failed to mention that the government of India passed a law ordering cell phone towers to lower their power output by 10 percent. So once again, we cannot deny a permit based on health concerns. However there are many other reasons to reject this permit such as I had previously stated that we are not here to sub lease school property to any commercial concern to improve their bottom line or to give them an unfair advantage of market penetration and by lowering their costs of doing business if the permit is allowed. Since this is not an essential service it would be easy to deny the permit given the fact that all the residents that surrounds the school are against approval of this project. Also it was ludicrous of the photo shop picture of what the site would look like with the 65 foot pine tree, since the picture was taken at about 100 yards away and of course as anyone knows the further away from an object you are the small the object appears to be.

I have lived in Peoria since 1994 and I have never seen a 65 foot tall pine tree in the city of Peoria have you? This could also have repercussions on property prices as more and more information becomes available and maybe when the FCC unmutes itself on the subject matter. I also believe that the environmental agency of the city of Peoria should have a RF meter to do a stare and compare of RF radiation on properties such as the elementary school and then take a reading at the Peoria high school football field and do a comparison. Just for due diligence sake, and accurate knowledge of what is going on even when the FCC is mute.

The city of Peoria has a great opportunity not only to deny this permit on legitimate grounds, but to then take it a step further, and move to put in place regulations that would deny any permits to any commercial concern, when it is to be located on school property. This would show the rest of the country that that the City of Peoria is in fact progressive and a leader not a

follower when it comes to its zoning regulations and to, smart growth and development. By placing school grounds off limits to any type of commercial use will resolve multiple issues. This type of action will also negate any concerns of possible health effects long term. It would also keep commercial concerns to designated commercial areas. By doing so the FCC directive becomes mute.

At this time I would like to thank all the commissioners for their time in this matter, and I hope I have been of assistance in forwarding this information to help everyone make an informed decision

Allow me to introduce myself, my name is Ernest deciutiis and my address is [REDACTED] my E-mail address is [REDACTED]) my cell # is [REDACTED]

I am writing to you, and forwarding information that I believe is extremely important, for everyone in our neighborhood, and our community at large. This is in reference to the proposed (Conditional Use Permit for a 65 foot tall wireless communication facility) know as CU16-0022 – PHO Shangri-La.

I would like to give you a small glance of my back ground, so you are not mislead in your thinking about my intentions. Many years ago I was a TV repairman. I also was part of a large radio club both, for short wave and citizen band, so I have a greater understanding of radio transmissions and technical subject matters than the average layperson, and have been involved in the technical field all of my adult life and now, I am in my late sixties and under good conscious, I have to join, with all of my neighbors that live in the homes surrounding the Peoria elementary school, in responding strongly against this project going forward.

Having attended the presentation given by the applicant at the Peoria elementary school and the, planning and zoning commission hearing, it has become clear, how wireless industry has manipulated, and seduced local school boards and municipalities to permit these projects to be built in residential zoned areas of our communities.

First and foremost, dangling the carrot of extra income for the school budget is very tantalizing. Who would object to outside income to the school district that would help with the school budgets? Secondly, the applicant immediately points to the FCC directive that permits, cannot be denied based on health risk due to high exposure to radiation from these cell sites. As you will see with the attached information, that the FCC has been mute on this subject since 2005. Unlike many other countries, and their world renowned scientists that have conducted many years of research since 2005, which shows a clear link between increased detrimental health effects to people that are in close proximity to these cell towers. Other countries and school boards, in our country are taking actions

to protect their citizens and school children. Now, knowing of these, ignored scientific studies, it would be morally reprehensible, not to inform the parents and staff of the exposure to RF radiation they would be subject to on a daily bases, if this project is allowed to go forward.

Given this information which is not new, and given the facts that other municipalities, and school boards and state governments, such as Connecticut, Los Angeles, Oregon, have already, prohibit cell towers near schools, we are left with no other choice but to join with them in asking the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the Peoria Union School District to reverse its position and to disallow any access to school properties for the purpose of building a cell site.
