Re: 83rd Ave & Happy Valley

I am writing this out of concern for the proposed shopping plaza/multi-housing/church site at 83rd Avenue and Happy Valley.

As of now there are primarily TWO ways to travel north from south or east of the 101, and that is via the 67th Avenue and 75th Avenue exits. These exits CANNOT handle more residents if a multi-housing unit is built north of here! Not only does traffic back up in both directions to enter the freeway, if you have ever tried to enter onto the freeway via 67th from the north going west bound during any time of heavy traffic, it is nearly impossible to merge on due to drivers in the right lane trying to exit at 75th or Union Hills. There are fender benders on this stretch ALL the time. It is also very difficulty to merge onto the 67th exit ramp coming from the west due to traffic merging onto the freeway via 75th Ave on ramp. 75th Ave north of the 101 can hardly handle the amount of traffic now with apartments, Mountainside Fitness, Dream City (former Church of Joy), fast food, daycare, office plazas, traffic lights, and a dead end at Deer Valley.

Because 83rd Avenue does not go straight through and becomes chaotic at the Lake Pleasant intersection, most people exit 75th rather than the Union Hills/Beardsley exit to travel Northwest. 67th backs up multiple times a day as it is the ONLY Avenue exit that goes straight up to Happy Valley, there is no other exit that takes travelers directly to Happy Valley other than I-17 (which is nightmarish enough with Sandra Day Traffic and the newly built townhouses). Along this route not only are there multiple shopping plazas, subdivisions, apartment buildings, but there are five schools, CCV, and the newest monstrosity known as LA Fitness. I live in Sonoran Mountain Ranch and have no choice other than to take 67th Avenue/Pyramid Peak Pkwy to travel to my house. Sometimes I have to sit through 3-4 lights at the 67th & Happy Valley intersection.

The 67th and Happy Valley intersection has become a disaster. There are multiple accidents (some resulting in deaths) that have occurred on or near here. First of all, trying to make a left (going northbound) out of the Super Wash/Dunken Donuts parking lot is rarely doable. I have had to turn right only to make a U-turn south of CCV in order to travel back north. If you make a right out of QT on to Happy Valley going east bound, very seldom can you make your way over to the far left lane if you need to turn left onto 67th to go north. I usually have to turn onto Happy Valley, travel through the intersection, and make a u-turn in the median somewhere over by the former Bank of America, only to travel back west and turn north onto 67th. It is also nearly impossible to turn left out of the Circle K/ Fry's parking lots to go southbound on 67th. Obviously CCV traffic during church services, sports practices and games, and unfortunately some funerals, adds to traffic back-ups and accidents on both 67th and Happy Valley.

This brings me to the proposed building site. Happy Valley between 83rd and 67th is already chaotic since 75th does not go through, which means anyone traveling north of the 101 is using one of these two avenues. There are two schools, Happy Valley Charter and Terramar that both cause traffic back-ups during morning and afternoon pickup, and parents are using driving lanes for parent pick-up because the parking lots are unable to accommodate the vehicles. Plus, CCV has one entrance from Happy Valley that allows church goers and sports teams to enter and exit directly across from both of these schools. Occasionally, if I am traveling from the west on Happy Valley, I can turn northbound onto 83rd and cut over via Jomax to 67th Ave. With added traffic at this intersection with the new plaza and apartments it will make the four-way-stop at Jomax back up considerably.

As for a potential Safeway and other retail to fill this space, it is worrisome that this will drive residents to the new "shiny" plaza and leave established retail and restaurants to vacate. The Albertson's plaza at 83rd and Deer Valley already has vacancies and is losing shoppers. Albertson's will most likely vacate and leave yet another abandoned building in our community. The former Basha's at Deer Valley and 67th has sat vacant for YEARS! I realize that corner is Glendale, but it is amongst our community! Not to mention many vacant store fronts in the southern areas of Peoria. Look at the *At Home* Plaza on 91st Avenue and Peoria Ave. It is full of vacant store fronts, the pavement has fallen apart, and the entire plaza looks scuzzy. Not to mention Grande which has sections of vacant buildings and parts that look like Detroit's inner-city.

Why not give tax incentives to investors to build or re-build in areas that are vacant or falling apart? If you keep driving all development north and leaving the southern and older areas to crumble, Peoria will succumb to the same statistics as so

many cities that have the "safe" side and the "ghetto" area. The only way to keep Peoria from having dumpy areas that draw in homeless, riffraff and gangs is to keep those areas nice, keep the buildings filled with life, and encourage people to want to be there to live and shop! These areas are so much more access ble as well, and with the stadiums so close could potentially turn into a place like old-town Scottsdale where people from all over want to come and walk and shop and eat!

Lastly, the beautiful desert landscape Peoria offers needs to be preserved. I have lived in SMR since 2006 and in the area for 22 years. So many of the residents enjoy hiking and mountain biking on trails that are not commercialized and full of tourists (like this new "Trailhead" plaza trails will be, or like Came back Mountain or Squaw Peak!).

Please consider NOT building at the 83rd and Happy Valley intersection! This proposal does not serve northwest residents well at all!
